CEE PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



The Center for Excellence in Education (CEE) has made scheduling changes for the wellbeing and safety of students, teachers, and all essential staff due to COVID-19. The Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT) canceled all K-12 summer programs on its campus so the Research Science Institute (RSI) will not take place as traditionally structured for the first time in 36 years. However, online virtual programming, exciting virtual activities, and remote research mentorships are planned for the students. RSI's older alumni are instrumental in providing the mentorships for this project.

The Teacher Enrichment
Program's spring and summer
local events in underrepresented
and urban districts will be
rescheduled; however webinars
and other science and technology
opportunities are presently being
scheduled. The USA Biolympiad
will unfortunately not take place;

the International Committee in Japan canceled the competition.

The coronavirus has provided an opportunity for the Center to review programs and to dialogue more fully with CEE Trustees and staff about strategic expansion and sustainability. It also has provided time to interface with major donors and the alumni of CEE's programs who are actively involved in all CEE efforts.

This is a time for all of us to be cautious and optimistic; not to focus on gloom and doom. Recall the old adage, "When times get tough, the tough get going."

The Center is fortunate to have a Board of Trustees and staff that are advising and daily reviewing economic and social issues of short and long term impact.

The Alumni Capital Campaign has been extended until the end of May, and the goal of \$450K is expected to be met. CEE's friends and supporters can assuredly look forward to the continuance of a vibrant and active organization. Your continued support is crucial, and I have confidence that you will continue to join the Center in advancing and achieving its mission.

The RSI Selection Committee, comprised of distinguished STEM professionals, met at CEE in mid-February 2020 to select students chosen for academic merit. demonstrated leadership, and scientific achievement. The 2020 Research Science Institute (RSI) was scheduled for June 21- August 1 on the MIT campus in Cambridge, Massachusetts. The RSI will now take place virtually.

The Center's RSI program continues to be nationally and internationally recognized with nations waiting for an opportunity to send scholars to this prestigious, cost-free program.

7 RSI AMONG TOP 40 SCHOLARS IN REGENERON SCIENCE TALENT SEARCH



Seven RSI alumni are among the top 40 finalists in the Regeneron Science Talent Search 2020, the nation's oldest and most prestigious science and math competition for high school seniors. They are: Cynthia Chen, San Jose, CA; Lauren Chen, Irmo, SC; Helena Jiang, Gainesville, Florida; Rupert Li, Portland, OR; Jason Liu, Reno, NV; Nadine Meister, Ellicott City, MD; and Zhifei Yu, Phillips Academy, Andover, MA.

"This is a wonderful accomplishment for Research Science Institute alumni and CEE," said Joann DiGennaro, CEE President. "I am so very proud of these students who represent the future of U.S. global leadership in science and technology."

The Regeneron Science Talent Search finalists were selected from 300 scholars and from nearly 2,000 entrants based on the originality and creativity of their scientific research, as well as their achievement and leadership both inside and outside of the

classroom. The full list of RSI alumni finalists and their research topics can be viewed here. The students are geographically represented from across the United States.

The Society for Science & the Public and Regeneron postponed the 2020 Regeneron Science Talent Search, originally planned for March 5-11 in Washington, D.C., until this summer.

USA BIOLYMPIAD

USA BIOlympiad

The 2020 USA Olympiad Finals, which were planned to be held at Marymount University, have been canceled by a decision from CEE's Board of Trustees. Although the final exam was moved up to late April, many high schools notified CEE that they would remain closed throughout spring. The exam could not be given online. The International Olympiad Committee also subsequently canceled the global competition.

Nearly 500 U.S. high schools registered for the 2020 USABO. Semi-finalists representing approximately 10 percent of the 5,300 test-takers were awarded certificates for their academic achievement.

Over 100,000 high school students, representing 47 states, have participated in the annual USA Biolympiad since 2002 when the competition was inaugurated. In 2019 nearly 10,000 students registered to participate in this prestigious opportunity. The USABO mission concentrates on stimulating young scholars' intellectual curiosity and developing their critical thinking in laboratory skills and biological reasoning to propel them to careers of excellence and leadership in science and technology.

TEACHER ENRICHMENT PROGRAM



Teacher Enrichment Program

CEE's Teacher Enrichment Program (TEP) had a great start to the 2019 – 2020 school year, hosting 12 sessions in under-represented urban and rural districts of Virginia, Maryland, Pennsylvania and California. While all remaining in-person events for the school year have been canceled due to COVID-19, teachers will be provided with quality remote learning resources to help supplement teachers' curriculum

through this unprecedented time.


Additionally, TEP is working to provide teachers with virtual Bite of Science webinars to connect them with leading STEM experts across the country. These efforts will provide teachers with new ideas and captivating materials that complement and enhance their online teaching experience.

October regional meetings for 100 teachers are planned with speakers and hands-on classroom activities in Virginia and in Indiana.

TEP also is thrilled to welcome Molly Allen to its team. Her prior experience in middle and high school science education will be invaluable as TEP works to expand its reach both geographically and digitally. TEP is working to create a continuum of learning experiences and resources that provide teachers with high level STEM content that informs their practice.

TEP connects industry and academic representatives with teachers to create awareness of STEM career fields, the job skills required, and opportunities for their students to explore STEM subjects and career paths. TEP programming has been made available to teachers in California, Florida, Illinois, Indiana, Maryland, Pennsylvania, South Carolina, Texas, Virginia, Washington, D.C., and West Virginia. CEE collaborates with community colleges, universities, corporations, state agencies, and STEM representatives committed to improving teaching and learning. All TEP resources and professional development events are cost-free to participants. More than 3,200 teachers from 1,389 schools have participated in TEP's programming, positively impacting the STEM education of 543,000 students.
