

#### Commending the Center for Excellence in Education

WHEREAS, founded in 1983 by the late Admiral H.G. Rickover and Joann DiGennaro, the Center for Excellence in Education, formerly known as the Admiral H.G. WHEREAS, a significant number of teachers in the Commonwealth have benefited from the additional training and aupport offered by the Center for Excellence in Education, improving the quality of education for all students in the Commonwealth now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the General Assembly hereby commend the Center for Excellence in Education for its years of service to students and teachers in the Commonwealth; and, be it


